Rudewaan Arendse is a seasoned authority on precinct management, placemaking, sustainable industrial and local economic development, with over 30 years of impactful experience spanning the public, private, and international development sectors. His expertise encompasses strategic leadership, project implementation, and stakeholder engagement, consistently delivering transformative outcomes.

As a Complex Project Manager, Rudewaan has spearheaded high-impact initiatives, including the revitalisation of industrial spaces in four metros in South Africa, using pioneering frameworks such as an Industrial Space Maturity Model and a Municipal Industrial Space Revitalisation Toolkit that he developed. He has been instrumental in urban regeneration projects supported by the Cities Support Programme of National Treasury, the Coming Together Urban Integration Project in Bitou, the Philippi Stadium upgrade, the integration of 43 hospitals in the Northern Cape and Amazon's Africa Head Office in Cape Town.

He also evaluated the externalities of Tempelhofer Feld, a historic airport and Berlin's largest inner-city urban green space. Additionally, he was a member of MIT's Rebuild by Design (RBD) team, which developed a disaster-resilient design solution to improve climate resilience and flood protection in vulnerable coastal regions of the northeastern United States that were affected by Hurricane Sandy.

A recognised thought leader in eco-industrial development, Rudewaan has collaborated with global institutions, including the World Bank and UNIDO, to advance eco-industrial park approaches. His expertise extends to fostering inclusive growth through institutional and informal sector development, capacity building, and resource mobilisation.

His contributions have been acknowledged through prestigious accolades such as the Erasmus Mundus Masters Mobility Programme in heritage and urban studies at the University of Porto and a visiting scholarship at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) (2014–15), where he advanced research in urbanism. Additional honours include the Oliver Tambo Fellowship in Public Health Leadership, participation in the U.S. State Department's International Visitor Leadership Programme on Healthcare Management, and an Overseas Development Agency (ODA) grant for health facilities planning and management.
