

Summary

Urban Space Management (USM) manages the public space on behalf of stakeholders like Ithemba, AFHCO, Diversity and others within the dedicated boundary. The area has been developed into a City improvement district known as the Wider Maboneng Improvement District (WMID). Urban Space Management's services supplement those of the City of Joburg and we have built a positive partnership with all relevant stakeholders. The relevant stakeholders that assist in keeping the WMID a Safe and Clean area are SAPS, JMPD, CRUM, Pikitup, CPF and other MOEs. The community and neighbourhood also supports the initiative being led by the ward councillors of 61 and 123.

Social Employment Fund (SEF)

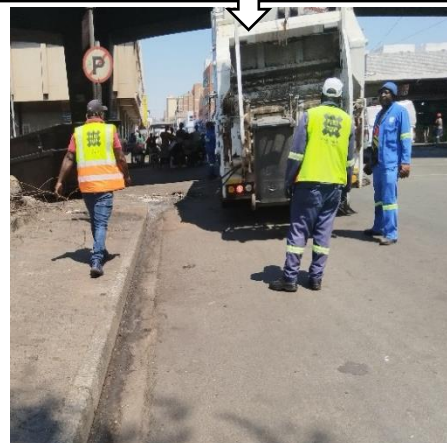

The SEF participants are divided into three shifts as they work twice per week from Monday to Fridays. The additional number of SEF has boosted our urban rangers to cover the bigger cleaning spaces/streets. The SEF participants are trained on different skills so that when permanent opportunities are avail, they will be read to work with different people. This is great initiative as unemployed youth are given an opportunity to gain different skills and such projects improve their lives by not doing wrong things.

Urban Rangers and SEF managed to unblock the blocked drainage on Main Street



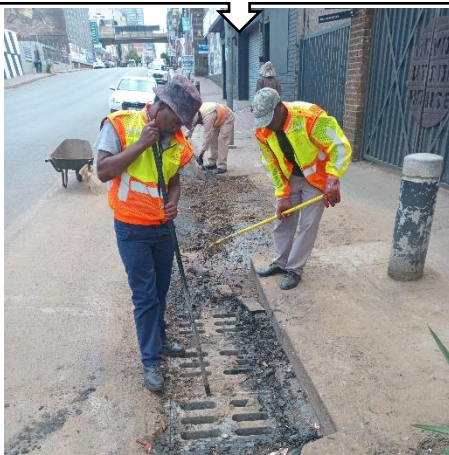
